- 14. Tomatoes, three table type (slicing) must have calyx attached.
- 15. Tomatoes, three ripe paste, same variety, calyx attached.
- 16. Beets, three round, same variety, topped 1/2" above crown
- 17. Potatoes, three white, same variety, named
- 18. Potatoes, three red, same variety, named
- 19. Carrots, three of one variety, topped 1/2" above crown
- 20. Beans, six specimens of one yellow variety, 1/4" stem left on.
- 21. Beans, six specimens of one green variety, 1/4" stem left on
- 22. Beans, six of a novelty variety, 1/4" stem left on, named
- 23. Cucumbers, three specimens of pickling variety (2-4") 1/4" stem left on.
